

LUUKA AUGUST REPORT 2016

WEEK 1

In this week we have received three cases of sick kids, two of them were suffering from malaria that is mugweri and Matege Andrew, then balonde leo who I having tumor on his right and he has not been able to go school due to the pain. The two kids are now recovering but balonde leo is still on treatment.

In our last month reports, we reported to you about the sick kids and guardians but right now only three are not fine and all are guardians but the rest doing well. We visited four homes and good enough we that all were doing well and were so appreciative for what KIDS had done for them like in educating their children, giving them medicine, clothing's and so on however the only challenge they have is of the weather since it shinning too much and most of the crops which of the crops which planted are now weathering. We have also conducted school visit and we were able to meet three schools and made it a point at least to meet four teachers, spending with them some time discussing about their performance, moral conducts and their relationships between them and the kids. In fact we wanted to meet only teachers but we ended up speaking to all of them where the head teacher buwetu primary school Mr. lukungu made a statement which stirred me up saying that, if this community we can have five people having the same mind like martin then people would be living to the potential of their lives. They appreciated so much for the love, responsibilities and supports which Luuka kids is rendering to them in their community.

WEEK 2

We have having a girl called nankyenga zatuin who had been in primary seven but this her dad reported to us that his daughter was missing after she was noted to have spent one night with a man and refused to come back home in the following morning however the man caught and right now he is jail with the girl still missing. But as a staff, we have sat and agreed that she is no longer on our program me

We had so patient with the girl where we even talked to her and the parents and promised to change but were just in vain.

This week we invited fifteen kids at the base just to create time and space to talk to them and to know how they were they doing. The fifteen were girls and all responded positively and fellowshipped together where we had time, being sincere and giving us all the information we wanted.

We also visited six homes including Pauls home whose grandmother is suffering from kidney disease, lungs and ulcers where we did our best and took her mulago hospital in kamuli district for examination and also proper treatments, where she is still admitted.

We also paid fees in the three schools for the 13 children. And visited more four new schools to check on the kids then there after go to their homes before we could start registering them. However this we

have already registered 14 new kids. And the teachers, kids and guardians from the new schools were so grateful for the offer.

WEEK 3

Our son EL-shalom had been down with malaria and the tooth problem, so martin to the clinic for extraction and at least now is recovering. However the rest of Mwesigwa family is doing well.

This week we received five people who came for the reading glasses and appreciated greatly. We have also sprayed one acres of our beans and they looking very nice and promising however we still have no enough rains which makes us to be worried and so keep praying with us.

Martin also visited the student at Sonshine Christian high school to take their pictures and details concerning each one of them and the following Sunday, the chap line of the school Mr.'s Rehema asked him to share with the word of God to the students where the message came from the book of genesis 12:1-4 which was about total obedience to God.

We have also conducted home visit and we were able to meet seven homes this week with two guardians suffering from malaria and eye problems.

Faith has also been very busy taking care of our children, giving out reading glasses and counseling some kids some come during the course of the week and two couples who had wrangles among themselves. She is also a Sunday school teacher.

WEEK 4

In this week generally health has not been good as we reported 14kids who were very ill suffering from malaria and skin disease and all were given medicine apart from flavia who totally down due to poor care from her grandmother and so we took her to stay with us to see how her conditions we be.

In the previous reports we had reported about the cases of illness of kids who are now doing better apart from mugaya frank who cut his hand as he was slashing in their garden at home and some families we visited in the last where some were having flu.

Weekend program me this month we have been able to held two meetings for our kids where we gave sanitary pads for girls, pant for boys, 5 blankets, jelly, soap and 34 families got solar lights and they were so grateful for services rendered to them by River valley community church.

We have also been making our updates by taking the photos of the kids a fresh and all the details of each one of them. And the total number of kids we have is (153) kids. But during the time of sending names and pictures, we sent only 149 forgetting 4 of them.
