

IGANGA KIDS REPORT JUNE2016

1ST WEEK

We gladly sent our warm gratitude giving thanks to God for your support. We were able to move around to homes as well as schools.

With some showers of rain some few guardians were in the gardens doing the last weeding for the season to wait to harvest.

However during the movement we were able to take a guardian to hospital for treatment [Bilungi Hunaisa's mum] and two other people from the community. This happened that during the movement to the orphans' home in their neighborhood there was an old man sick and no one was taking care so we had to take him for medication at the hospital of which he got treatment.

The orphans did receive the scholastic materials since they have started school. We did follow-up just to find out one school attendance. At school most of the pupils would dodge school in search of mangoes. We are grateful to God at least there is something to eat.

During our visitation guardians would give us mangoes. Just a sign of appreciation for the services they do receive.

We are thankful to God and you for He has answered our prayer. Early this year one of our guardian's house was burnt down to ashes and we have been trusting God for another one. As were moved to this home we realized that the community has joined hands together and are willing to help with the building. Their request is for us pay the builder. We embraced the idea and they are to start the third week of this month.

In our subcounty the government setting up a technical school to equip the young people with practical skills. We do thank God for that since that has been our desire for most of the children.

2nd week

We still continued with movement to homes as well as schools. We had some good time with the pupils at schools. We at least visited two schools. That is Homeland nursery and primary school and Walutaba primary school. We noted that they need school uniforms this ones are among the newly registered.

We had to talk at least to several orphans on different issues. One of the issues was absenting themselves from schooling and thank God we were able to understand the cause and we went ahead and addressed those issues. Reminding them of the importance of education. To some point the teachers were contributing to it and we addressed that too.

We had the weekend camp and sixty eight kids turned up. We happen to group them so that the little ones come on their own day likewise with the mature kids on their own day. The interesting thing is that some kids come for both even when we remind them of their day. We did our investigation and we learnt that they do struggle with feeding from their homes so when they come they are assured of the lunch.

We did some gardening during the Saturday camp whereby we had to weed some maize. And also some seed beds

During our fellowship at least three kids recommitted their lives to Christ.

3rd week

The constructions of the guardians' house has just started. As we moved there we saw the big smile on her face as if the house was complete. According to the builder it take close to one month to be finished. And it is a blessing to us to see the members of the community bring whatever they could just see the house is built. This included some food and even fire wood.

We at least moved to thirty homes and four school. This included three primary schools and one high school. The primary schools are getting ready for soccer. The inter school completions last term it was athletics whereby our kids participated to district level. We have always encouraged our kids to participate in this activities.

We also moved to the motor vehicle garage where our boy Peter is undergoing the training. He seem to have gotten some knowledge on how to fix some faults on the vehicle. His instructor says if he continues with that good discipline then he will retain him after he has acquired the skill.

Cases of sickness has been rampant especially cough and flu. We also had malaria cases.

4th week

This week had several things done. Beside the visitation, we attended the school parents' teachers association. It was such a meaningful meeting since we talked about good practical ways on how we can improve on the standards of education upon our children.

There was also the checking on the house construction in Naitandu village of the guardian. At least they have reached the wall plate and they are giving it time to set before the can do the roofing. We hope it will be roofed next week. We had the iron sheets bought. Thanks for your support.

Our movement to school included paying of school fees at least in six schools. The head teachers where we paid the fees were grateful mentioning that this helps with the smooth running of the school program. With the candidate classes they are meant to have weekly assement tests which are bought

We had to talk to the care giver of Emily Gloria since we heard gotten some complains. According to the guardian he said that the girl doesn't respect him but that is not true. He has been mistreating her since she isn't her child. During our talk with him we told him to treat her as if he was treating his own. Asking him a question that if he found his child being treated like that how would he feel.
