After a long time hustle in the mad, a project for a given target, Awali our crippled kid boy has come with a sum to behold and wonder looking at his physical state that is needy. He has made up to 5000 bricks burnt them and sold them. Out of all that he got, he paid off some debts and gave us shs240000 to keep for him. He has requested us to buy him a bicycle and pay part of his school fees. Though with the money, we are looking forward to .He has done such projects but have not helped him since the guardians have always used up his money for their joy. We thank God that he has trusted us and we are doing the best for him. When we gathered this camp, we let him share to the 72 that appeared this day and create a picture of yes we or I can in them. We later had classes as usual brainstorming and the like. We also gave out books since school was to be on next week. Those to Sonshine were to go but the same me that was to go with them was still to go with Spe for anti-nantal care . We got them into the van and were taken to school though the others were not ready to go with them by then but went later. Finally by the end of this week we have managed to reach 16 homes and met only 18 kids out of the 32 that reside from these homes. This was mostly because most families has gone on a pilgrimage (Martyrs day).

## WEEK 2 REPORT

It was so frustrating to behold when we looked at this 14 year old boy that had been a bused by his dad when he beat him while they were in the garden digging. The dad wanted this young boy to work the same rate and portion like his the boy tried but failed as he narrated the incidence. He had been seriously beaten and his shirt torn on the whole back. With tears rolling down his cheeks he said that even this shirt he tore, I bought it myself and I have to work for another one. We went to meet him and we wanted to take him to police but he requested for pardon as well as the community. Since the local leaders were also available we sat him down and later ordered him to take the child for medication. Betty a student at Teen Mission got sick a few days after reporting and was admitted at Nondwe trading center overnight. With treatment she got well soon and when I went to meet them she was well. I also had a number of issues to settle at school in various offices. Among which was David being suspended for two weeks for his unceasing misbehaving and was able to pay fees for 16 students out of the 20. As well I sat down with all the 20 Kaliro group as I had so disciplinary issues with them. We also had other more 7 Malaria case handled over this way as we visited. Mwases Peter secondary student has also proved rude to the guardian. He abuses and refuses to be used for any job available. Before the guardian we gave him two strokes to put him right.

## WEEK 3

In a nut shell, we have moved to 11 homes and have realized availability of food though others are in lack. This has excited us and reminded us the last guardian meeting that we had of which we discussed a number of developmental things including food security. In return we were given fresh maize, Ground nuts and Bananas. Though the school (sonshine) had mattresses, they are not enough for everybody but other students have to come with their own. As a result since my kids went to school a day after, they found all mats occupied. Unfortunately they did not have any at home so I had to buy two mattresses and send them to the school plus one that I got from this one family but it was old. Though malaria has been at its peak in the community flu and cough, we only had 3 reported cases among the kids territory. We thank God for the mosquito nets provided that are still helping as we have emphasized sleeping under them always.

#### WEEK 4

After having a number of talks to and with David the suspended boy of Sonshine, he was yet to go to school but could not make it on the expected date since the guardian that was to go with was busy somewhere else. Still a suitable time and day come to. We thank God that he is at school and promisingly good. Though most schools have picked up weekend teaching programs from Primary 3 to Primary 7, we hardly gather many for camps. As a result, we had 17 come this weekend and helped to clean up the compound trimming the hedge. We were able to give soap to all of them and also treated the other 12 that came later with eye problems as we put a drop in each of their eye and gave each to go with his after showing how to use it. As well two of these got saved as one attended service with us in the local church. With notice from the guardian about misbehaving characters on cases like watching films at late hours in trading centers and fornication, we visited these 7 homes to wipe this away and we thank God that the guardians have reported. This has become the greatest achievement in our relationship with the guardians. Surely someone stated that the same Sun that melts Margarine hardens a brick but truly I have seen this happen to me. Though I was busy with the above, my wife was in her labor pains and delivered as well. Though the doctors were there but Sally and Maggie stood in my place over that side in Jinja at the main hospital. We thank God for being there always for us. I always say that if I do His job He will definitely do mine.
